

Bilby Blooms Plant List August 2026

Species List
<i>Acacia covenyi</i>
Large shrub or small tree 3-6mH x 3-6mW. Attractive grey foliage. Large, bright yellow ball flowers in spring. Full or filtered sun with good drainage, tolerates limestone. Spectacular plant.
<i>Acacia cultriformis</i>
Shrub 2mH x 3mW. Grey triangular foliage and masses of golden flower balls in spring. Dry position in sun to part shade. Most draining soils. Long-lived attractive screen plant. Foliage good for floristry.
<i>Acacia deanei</i>
Tall shrub 3mH x 3mW with ferny leaves and pale yellow flowers in summer and sporadic. Dry or moist draining sandy or clay soils in open position. Quick shade or erosion control.
<i>Acacia floribunda</i>
Large shrub to 3mH x 3mW with graceful dense dark green leaves. Scented cream rod flowers in early spring. Grows in a wide range of soils, even clay, likes extra moisture. Dappled shade, part or full sun. Fast growing screen.
<i>Acacia implexa</i>
Small tree to 4-6mH x 4mW. Long curved foliage. Pale yellow ball flowers in autumn and much curved and twisted pods. Draining soils in full or filtered sun. A hardy species which tolerates dryness.
<i>Acacia paradoxa</i>
Kangaroo thorn. Medium shrub 2mH x 1.5mW with small hooked foliage and thorns. Bright yellow globular flowers in spring. Grows in a wide range of soils in partial or full sun. Great bird habitat. Drought hardy.
<i>Acacia piligera</i>
Open shrub to 2mH with round glaucous phyllodes. Deep yellow flowers appearing in spring, or weeks after rain. For light to medium soils in full sun to part shade. A useful companion plant.
<i>Acacia podalyriifolia</i>
Silvery grey tree 6mH x 5mW with rounded foliage. Massed golden flowers from autumn to spring and large grey pods. Moist well-drained or dry soils in sunny position. Prune for bushy habit. Quick growing and decorative. Foliage used for floristry.
<i>Acacia rigens</i>
Medium to tall shrub 1-2mH x 1-2mW with rounded habit. Narrow stiff grey foliage with bright yellow ball flowers at base of leaves in spring-summer, and sporadic. Moist or dry sites in full or part sun. Frosty and drought hardy
<i>Acacia spectabilis (orange)</i>
Mudgee wattle. Tall shrub to small tree 2-4mH x 2-3mW with weeping habit, silver bark & bluish-grey lacy leaves. Showy, bright orange flower balls Sept-Oct. Most well-drained soils in full sun. Good specimen plant. Drought hardy.
<i>Acacia verniciflua</i>
Varnish Wattle. Variable shrub to 4mH x 4mW. Long elliptical foliage, shiny when young. Yellow ball flowers in spring. Hardy in fairly well-drained light to heavy soils. Best in dappled shade but will take full sun.
<i>Acacia vestita</i>
Beautiful weeping large shrub 3mH x 5mW. Hairy triangular grey-green foliage and golden flowers in winter and spring. Hardy in most soils in partial or full sun. Feature plant or hedge. Recommended.

Species List
<i>Acacia victoriae</i>
Erect or spreading prickly shrub, 2-7mH x 2- 5mW, dark grey bark and thorns at base of straight phyllodes. Pale yellow or white ball flowers in spr, and wide flat pods. Sun or part shade in moist sand or clay soils.
<i>Allocasuarina luehmannii</i>
Bullock. Rough-barked erect tree 5-15mH x 5-8mW with long wiry branches and dull- green foliage. Male flower spikes are yellowish, female cones wider than high. Wide range of soils in most sites. Good shelter tree.
<i>Anigozanthos 'Orange Cross'</i>
Kangaroo Paw. Vigorous clumping plant 1.2mH x 1.5mW, strappy leaves. Vivid orange flowers late spr & sum. Moist to dry well-drained soils, full to part sun. Recovers from frost damage. Water weekly in dry winter.
<i>Anigozanthos 'Regal Claw'</i>
Kangaroo Paw. Small clumping plant to 0.4mH x 0.2-0.8mW with strap-like leaves. Stems of orange flowers covered with red hairs in spr-sum. For most well-drained light-medium soils, full or part sun. Protect from heavy frost.
<i>Anigozanthos flavidus (bright red)</i>
Kangaroo Paw. Vigorous clumping plant to 1mH x 1mW with thick strappy leaves. Tubular vibrant red flowers on 2m stems Nov- Feb. For light to medium soils in partial to full sun. Recovers from frost damage.
<i>Anigozanthos flavidus (green)</i>
Kangaroo Paw. Vigorous clumping plant to 1mH x 1mW with thick strappy leaves. Tubular green flowers on 2m stems in Nov- Feb. For light to medium soils in partial to full sun. Recovers from frost damage.
<i>Arthropodium sp. B</i>
Vanilla Lily. 0.3mH x 0.3mW. Grass like leaves, pretty pale lilac flowers on long stems to 0.8mH Nov-Feb. Anthers pale green. Most conditions in shade or part sun. Dies back in winter. Tubers can be eaten. Good in pots.
<i>Asterolasia beckersii</i>
'Dungowan Creek' Medium shrub 1-3.5mH x 1-2mW, blunt green leaves. Cream flowers Sept-Dec. For moist well-drained soils in dappled shade to partial sun. Mulch well. Most ornamental species. Very rare.
<i>Backhousia citriodora</i>
Lemon Myrtle Large shrub to 5m with dense canopy. Lemonie fragrant leaves and flowers are the highlight of this wonderful bush food. Accepts most draining soils. Protect from frost when young. Can be used as an indoor pot plant.
<i>Baloskion tetraphyllum</i>
Creeping plant with erect stems to 1mH with finely divided plume-like branches. Grow in full sun in damp soil near or in water. Feature foliage plant for pots, and floral arrangements.
<i>Banksia blechnifolia</i>
Creeping plant 0.2-0.4mH x 2mW, horizontal branches, deeply lobed long dark- green leaves. Salmon flowers girt the plant from Sept-Feb. For a sunny site, in draining soil. Drought and frost hardy
<i>Banksia burdettii</i>
A much branched medium sized shrub to 1.5mH x 1.5mW. Spectacular bright orange flowers are borne at the end of branches. Prefers sandy or well drained acid soils. Drought and frost tolerant when established

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<i>Banksia ericifolia (dwarf)</i>
Medium bushy shrub to 1.5mH x 1mW. Bright green linear leaves, cylindrical orange flowers. Hardy screen or hedge plant in most positions with moist well-drained soil. Bird attracting.
<i>Banksia integrifolia 'Roller Coaster'</i>
Cascading groundcover to 0.5mH x 5mW Silver foliage. Yellow spike flowers in autumn and winter. Most soils and aspects suitable. Good for coastal plantings. Bird attracting.
<i>Banksia integrifolia (dwarf)</i>
Low growing shrub to 1.5mH x 1.5mW. Silver foliage. Yellow spike flowers in autumn and winter. Most soils and aspects suitable. Good for coastal plantings. Bird attracting.
<i>Banksia marginata</i>
Large shrub to small tree 3-5mH x 2-3mW. Silver backed foliage. Yellow flowers in autumn and winter. Most well-drained positions. Tolerates some shade. Hardy banksia.
<i>Banksia menziesii (compact)</i>
A compact shrub to 2mH x 3mW, oblong toothed leaves. Flowerheads silvery red with golden styles Feb-Aug. Warm sunny spot, light to medium draining soil. Drought hardy. Spectacular flower.
<i>Banksia petiolaris</i>
A spreading prostrate shrub 0.3-0.6mH x 2- 3mW, horizontal branches, large wavy toothed leaves. Flowerheads purple becoming yellow Aug-March girt the plant. For well-drained soils in dappled shade, partial to full sun.
<i>Banksia pilostylis</i>
Bushy small shrub to 1.2mH x 1.5mW with slender toothed leaves. Creamy yellow scented flowers to 12cm in spring/ summer. Needs good drainage and full sun with frost protection in its first year.
<i>Banksia prionotes</i>
A large shrub to 4m tall. Grey deeply serrated leaves to 20 cm long. Large ornamental orange terminal flowers to 20 cm, during Autumn. Prefers well drained soils. Frost and drought tolerant when established. Great cut flower
<i>Banksia robur</i>
Swamp Banksia. Medium shrub to 2mH x 2mW. Attractive reddish new growth. Stiff oaklike leaves, greenish flowers ageing to yellow all year. Sunny position. Adapts to a variety of sites and soils. Likes extra water but withstands quite dry periods.
<i>Banksia speciosa</i>
Showy Banksia. Many branching shrub to 4m. Very long leaves with triangular lobes. Showy lemon cream flower cones spring- autumn. For well-drained light to heavy soils in partial to full sun. Frost protection when young.
<i>Banksia spinulosa</i>
Bushy shrub 2-4mH x 2-4mW with narrow toothed leaves, pale below. Honey coloured flowers with purplish spines in autumn/ winter. Suits draining acid soils in sun or part shade. Suitable under Eucalypts. Bird plant.
<i>Banksia undata var. splendens</i>
syn Dryandra praemorsa. Bushy medium shrub 2-4mH x 2-4mW with long, toothed foliage. Yellow or pink flowers in spring. Prefers well-drained soil in dappled shade or part sun. Useful screening plant. Bird attracting.
<i>Beaufortia sparsa</i>
Upright medium shrub 2mH x 2mW with many small narrow leaves. Brilliant red bottlebrush flowers in summer. Sunny well-drained position with shelter from frost. Prune after flowering.

Species List
<i>Blandfordia grandiflora</i>
Christmas Bells. Small narrow leaved tufty plant to 0.5mH x 0.4mW. Tall stems with groups of large waxy scarlet and gold bells in late spring-summer. Moist or wet well drained soils in full or filtered sun. Very good container plant.
<i>Brachychiton discolor</i>
Lace Bark. Small to medium tree 4-10m. Soft hairy large leaves with blunt lobes. Large clusters of red to pink tubular flowers each 5cm across. Large decorative pods after flowering. Very drought resistant. Protect from frost when young.
<i>Brachychiton populneus</i>
Kurrajong. Small spreading tree 10mH x 4mW. Dense rounded crown and shiny leaves often lobed. Cream bell-shaped flowers, reddish inside, Oct-Feb. Tolerates wide range of soils and climates.
<i>Brachyscome 'Magenta Bliss'</i>
Small suckering groundcover 0.1mH x 0.5mW. Green partially divided leaves, profuse bright pink daisy flowers most of the year. Full sun to partial shade. Prefers regular moisture. For best show prune away old stems in late winter.
<i>Bulbine bulbosa</i>
Small perennial herb 0.4mH with greyish leaves and butter-yellow flowers, held above leaves, in spring. Adapts well to most positions and soils. May die back in winter or dry summer. Good container plant.
<i>Bulbine semibarbata</i>
Leek Lily. Small perennial herb to 0.5mH x 0.1-0.3mW with succulent light green leaves. Many stems of yellow flowers to 1.4cm across in spring and summer. For most soils in sun to dappled shade. Good regeneration from seed.
<i>Callistemon citrinus 'Purple Splendour'</i>
Densely foliated large shrub 2-3mH x 2mW, silky new growth. Prominent oil glands make leaf margins appear serrated. Flower spikes reddish-purple with yellow anthers Oct to Dec. For a wide range of soils and conditions.
<i>Callistemon comboyensis</i>
Spreading shrub 1.5mH x 2mW, lanceolate leaves, copper coloured new growth. Dull red brushes summer & winter. Hardy in most soils in sun or part shade. Tall ground cover or low screen. Attracts birds.
<i>Callistemon pearsonii 'Rocky Rambler'</i>
Prostrate-0.3mH x 1.5mW. Deep red brushes with golden anthers in summer. For acidic soils in sun to semi- shade. May get tip damage from heavy frost.
<i>Callistemon phoeniceus</i>
A large shrub 2-4mH x 3-5mW with narrow rigid greyish-green foliage. Spectacular bright rich red brushes from Nov-Jan. For a sunny position in most soils. Prune after flowering.
<i>Callistemon pinifolius (red)</i>
Open medium shrub to 1.5mH x 1.5mW with very narrow sharply pointed leaves. Red flower spikes in summer. Full sun. Hardy and adaptable to most conditions, even poor soils. Prune for shape regularly after flowering.
<i>Callistemon sieberi</i>
River bottlebrush. Large shrub to 2.5mH x 2mW with narrow leaves and cream flowers in summer. Hardy in most conditions with part or full sun. Prune to keep shape and promote flowering.

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<i>Callistemon viminalis</i>
Weeping tree 6mH x 3mW with narrow leaves. Silky new growth. Long red brushes in spring, summer and autumn. Prune for autumn flowers. Takes wide range of soils in full sun. Not for frost hollows.
<i>Calostemma lutea</i>
Lily-like plant 0.3m tall. Yellow flowers on long stems appear from Jan-April. Best in full sun. Good in a rockery, apply fertiliser to improve growth. Protect from slugs and snails. Dies back to a bulb in Autumn.
<i>Calostemma purpureum</i>
Lily-like plant 0.3-0.6m tall. Heads of purple or pink flowers on long stems appear from Jan-April. Best in full sun. Good in a rockery with reasonable drainage. Apply fertiliser to improve growth. Protect from slugs and snails.
<i>Calothamnus homalophylla</i>
Upright shrub 3mH x 5mW. Broad green leaves, unique to this species. Red flowers in one-sided spikes in spr/sum. Most well-drained soils in full or part sun. Protect from frost when young. Hardy bird plant.
<i>Calothamnus quadrifidus (grey leaf)</i>
Common Net Bush. Upright shrub 2mH x 2mW. Grey pine-like hairy leaves. Red flowers in one-sided spikes in spr/sum. Most well-drained soils in full or part sun. Protect from frost when young. Bird plant.
<i>Carex appressa</i>
Tall Sedge. A clumping tussock which may grow to 0.8mH with brown flowerheads in spring and summer. It grows well in most positions even water logging, in full sun. It can handle dry periods. Strong roots good for erosion control.
<i>Casuarina cristata</i>
Belah. Shelter or shade tree to 12mW. Long dark green needle-like foliage, with large attractive woody cones. Flowers Dec-Jan. Handles most soils from well drained to wet, saline and alkaline. Glossy black cockatoo food.
<i>Casuarina cunninghamiana</i>
River Sheoak. Shelter or shade tree to 20mH x 12mW. Needle-like foliage, woody cones. Most draining soils, full sun. Grows on riverbanks. Controls soil by suckering. Very fast growing. Provides Glossy Black Cockatoo food.
<i>Casuarina glauca prostrate</i>
Cousin It - Cascading ground cover without flowers. Long dark green needle-like foliage, spreading from a rounded mound. Most soils, full or part sun. Excellent in rockeries as it will cascade over rocks.
<i>Chrysocephalum apiculatum</i>
Perennial herb 0.2-0.4mH x 0.5-2mW. Variable, green or grey leaves. Clusters of small golden flowers all the year. Needs reasonable drainage and sun. Good in massed plantings. Can be suckering.
<i>Chrysocephalum apiculatum (suckering)</i>
Perennial herb with slender grey leaves 0.2mH x 0.5-2mW. Clusters of small golden flowers all the year. Reasonable drainage and sun. Prune in spring. Good in massed plantings.
<i>Convolvulus angustissimus</i>
Small plant 0.1H x 0.5mW with a trailing habit. Rosy pink flowers Oct-Mar. Good mulch substitute supressing weeds..Drought hardy

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<i>Correa 'Bilby Bells'</i>
Open, upright shrub to 1.5mH x 1.5mW with grey-green leaves. Large bright red bells with lime-green tips in aut/win/spring. Needs a draining site in part sun or dappled shade. Tolerates dry periods when established. Tip prune.
<i>Correa 'Bilby Blush'</i>
Small shrub 1mH x 1mW with dark green leaves and upright habit. Large red bell flowers autumn to spring. Draining soils in shade or full sun. Bird plant. Frost and drought hardy. Bred by Bilby Blooms
<i>Correa 'Bindaga Pink'</i>
Small shrub 0.75mH x 1.5mW. Dark green oval leaves with pink flowers from late Autumn through winter. Dry or moist draining soils in shade or semi shade. Frost hardy. Bird attracting. Bred by Bilby Blooms
<i>Correa 'Dusky Bells'</i>
Small dense shrub 0.6mH x 2mW with oval leaves. Dusky pink bells in autumn and winter. For heavy and clay soils in moist or dry conditions in full sun or shade. Long flowering, attracts birds. Prune regularly.
<i>Correa 'Federation Belle'</i>
Hardy shrub to 0.6-1mH x 1mW with compact dark green foliage. Large, showy pink bells with cream tip from summer to winter. For sun to part shade in draining soils. Attracts birds, good in pots.
<i>Correa 'Mannii'</i>
Arching branched shrub 1mH x 1mW with rounded dark green leaves, paler below. Dark red bells in autumn, winter and spring. Likes dry or moist well-drained soils in full or filtered sun. Bird plant.
<i>Correa 'Pink Mist'</i>
Small dense shrub 1mH x .8mW with oval leaves. Pinky bells in autumn and winter. For a wide range of draining soils in moist or dry conditions in full sun or shade. Long flowering, attracts birds. Prune regularly.
<i>Correa 'White Lies'</i>
Small dense shrub 0.4mH x 2mW with oval leaves. Pure white flared bells in autumn and winter. For draining soils in moist or dry conditions in full sun or shade. Attracts birds. Prune regularly. Bred by Bilby Blooms
<i>Correa 'White Tips'</i>
Shrub 1.5mH x 1.5mW . Very pretty pink bells with white tips in autumn and winter. For draining soils in moist or dry conditions in full sun or shade. Attracts birds. Prune regularly.
<i>Correa 'Wynn's Wonder'</i>
Dense varigieted leafed shrub 1mH x 1mW . Rose pink bells in autumn and winter. For draining soils in moist or dry conditions in full sun or shade. Attracts birds. Prune regularly.
<i>Correa reflexa var. speciosa 'Jester'</i>
Very attractive open shrub 1mH x 1mW with soft aromatic leaves. Large red bell flowers with yellow lobes in autumn and winter. Freely draining soils in sun or part shade. Prune from early age.
<i>Crinum flaccidum</i>
Darling Lily. Vigourously growing lily once the season warms with large white clustered scented flowers on a robust stem to 0.6m mid to late Summer. Edible bulbs occur after flowering, Winter dormant. Prefers sunny clay position

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<i>Crowea ‘Festival’</i>
Small showy dense shrub 1.5mH x 1.5mW with small narrow leaves. Deep pink star flowers in spring, summer and autumn. For dry or moist well-drained mulched soils in full or filtered sun. Responds to heavy pruning.
<i>Crowea ‘Poorinda Ecstasy’</i>
Showy small shrub 1mH x 1mW with narrow leaves. Large waxy pink flowers in summer, autumn and winter. For dry or moist well-drained mulched soils in filtered or part sun. Responds to pruning.
<i>Daviesia cordata</i>
Medium shrub to 2mH x 1-2mW, heart- shaped leaves. Bright orange-yellow & purplish-red flowers Sept-Nov. For well-drained light to medium soil in partial or full sun. Tolerates medium frosts & pruning. Good pot plant.
<i>Daviesia latifolia</i>
Medium shrub 1-3mH x 1-2mW, with broad mid green leaves. Long racemes of yellow/brown pea flowers in spring. For most well drained soils in dappled shade to part sun. Informal hedge. New to cultivation.
<i>Dendrobium kingianum</i>
Rock Orchid. Pot or slab culture recommended. Green, elliptic leaves to 12cms x 3cms are there all year. Racemes of pink or white flowers are seen from September to November.
<i>Derwentia arenaria</i>
Small to medium shrub 0.6-1.5mH x 1- 2mW with narrow leaves. Pale to deep violet-blue flowers are profuse and conspicuous from Sept-May. For moderately draining acidic soils in sun or semi-shade. Rare plant.
<i>Derwentia perfoliata</i>
Perennial to 0.6mH x 1mW with arching stems of grey green ovate leaves. Terminal sprays of bright blue flowers in summer. Full sun to part shade. Very hardy. Prune off old stems late winter.
<i>Dianella ‘Currabubula’</i>
Blue Berry Lily. Attractive plant with grey blue leaves to 0.75mH x 1mW. Pale blue flowers along 1m upright stems in spring & summer, develop into profuse large showy bright blue tasty fruit. Accepts most soils and aspects
<i>Dianella longifolia var. longifolia</i>
A tufty plant to 0.3-0.7mH x 0.5mW. Flower spikes to 1.5m with pale blue flowers in spring; small purple berries follow. For a wide variety of soils in full sun to part shade or a spot with other small shrubs.
<i>Dianella revoluta</i>
Spreading Flax Lily. Tufted plant with flax- like leaves, suckering to form clumps to 2.5mW. Bright blue flowers on branched stems, bright blue fruits. Very hardy. Ideal garden plant esp. for rockeries.
<i>Dianella tasmanica</i>
Flax Lily. Tufted plant with thick strap leaves to 1mH. Blue flowers in long spikes spring-summer followed by stunning purple berries. Wide range of soils including heavy clay. Use throughout the garden as a contrast plant. Very hardy.
<i>Dichondra repens</i>
Prostrate herb 1-2mW rooting at the nodes, with kidney-shaped leaves and tiny cream-green flowers in spring-summer. Very hardy ground cover in a wide range of conditions. Lawn alternative for low traffic.

Species List
<i>Dillwynia sericea</i>
Small shrub 0.6-0.8mH x 0.6-0.8mW with small narrow leaves. Yellow and red pea flowers in spring and summer. Well-drained soils in part shade or full sun. Withstands dry periods. Grows under trees. Container plant.
<i>Enchylaena tomentosa</i>
A small shrub to about 1mH with lovely grey foliage. Insignificant flowers produce edible bright red, pink or orange coloured fruits. Very drought tolerant, full to part sun, in most soils. Tolerates salt and moderate frosts
<i>Eremophila ‘Passionate Lady’</i>
E bignoniifolia x alternifolia Large shrub 3mH x 3mW (growth is restricted by pruning). Bright- green leaves & hot pink flowers Sept-May. For a hot, sunny site for a wide range of soils. Frost and drought tolerant.
<i>Eremophila ‘Summertime Blue’</i>
Dense shrub 1.5mH x 1.5mW. Narrow shiny dark green foliage, large showy blue flowers in summer. Full or part sun in most soils in dry spot with overhead cover, will take water logging. Tip prune. Rockery, low screen.
<i>Eremophila glabra (Streaky Bay)</i>
Small shrub to 0.5mH x 1mW. Vibrant red-orange tubular flowers Aug-March and sporadic. For draining soils in full sun in an open spot. Can be pruned hard. Bird attracting, drought hardy.
<i>Eremophila maculata ‘Aurea’</i>
Vigorous small shrub 0.9mH x 1-2mW with dark green leaves and bright lime-yellow flowers that are well-displayed. Good drainage and sun or semi-shade are best. Will tolerate heavy soils. Responds to pruning.
<i>Eremophila maculata ‘Pink Passion’</i>
Shrub 1mH x 1mW. Small leaves, tubular rich pink flowers in winter-spring. Best in heavier soils with drainage in part to full sun. Provides nectar for birds. Frost and very drought hardy.
<i>Eremophila maculata x racemosa</i>
Medium upright shrub to 1.5mH. Yellow then orange buds open to pink flowers with a white fringe inside the throat of the flower. For a wide range of soils in full to part sun. Prune to shape. Bird attractant.
<i>Eremophila racemosa</i>
Showy variable shrub 0.3-2mH x 0.3- 1.5mW, narrow leaves. Tubular flowers open orange and age to reddish purple. Well-drained soil, full or part sun. Takes dry times. Protect from wind. Light prune. Good in pots.
<i>Eremophila racemosa ‘Peaches and Cream’</i>
Showy variable shrub to 2mH x 1.5mW with narrow green leaves. Tubular yellow buds changing to white flowers in spring. Draining soil in full or part sun. Takes dry times. Light prune.
<i>Eucalyptus ‘Little Princess’</i>
Mallee to 3mH x 3mW. Decorative bark, upright habit, grey foliage & large pink flowers April- Sept. Draining acid to slightly alkaline soils. Full to part sun. Protect from heavy frost when young. Bred by Bilby Blooms
<i>Eucalyptus ‘Silver Princess’</i>
Eucalyptus caesia subsp. magna. Mallee 8-15mH x 3-5mW, decorative bark, pendulous branches, glaucous foliage & large red flowers June-Nov. For fairly well- drained acid to slightly alkaline soils, sunny site. Frost protection when young.

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<i>Eucalyptus albens</i>
White Box. Med/large tree 15-25mH x 10- 15mW. Fibrous flaky grey bark, grey-green leaves, white flowers in autumn, winter. Widespread in woodland. Grows in a wide range of soils.
<i>Eucalyptus blakelyi</i>
Medium tree to 20mH x 10-15mW with short straight trunk & widely spreading crown. White flowers Aug-Dec. Adapts to many soil types. For shade, woodlots & windbreaks on farms. Good Koala tree.
<i>Eucalyptus camaldulensis</i>
River Red Gum. Tree to 30mH x 10-20mW, white to grey trunk, lanceolate green leaves. Profuse white flowers Dec-Feb. Adaptable to a wide range of soils & climates. For shade & soil erosion control on farms, parks & roadsides.
<i>Eucalyptus conica</i>
Fuzzy Box. Med/large tree 10-20mH x 10- 15mW. Fibrous flaky brown bark, green leaves, white flowers in autumn, winter. Widespread in woodland in a range of soils.
<i>Eucalyptus largiflorens</i>
Medium sized highly ornamental box tree to 20m. For heavy clay to black soils. Greenish grey lance shaped leaves, yellow flower buds opening to white flowers.Handles intermittent flooding.
<i>Eucalyptus lehmannii</i>
Rounded tree often with mallee habit to 6mH x 3-4mW, dark-green lanceolate leaves. Large ball-like clusters of green flowers Aug-Oct followed by unusual gumnuts. For well-drained soils in a sunny spot. Frost protect at least when young.
<i>Eucalyptus macrocarpa</i>
Sprawling mallee shrub 1-4mH x 1-4mW, with opposite large silvery leaves. The glaucous buds are followed by showy pink-red flowers (10cm) throughout the year. Accepts most draining soils. Frost and drought tolerant
<i>Eucalyptus macrocarpa (Upright)</i>
Upright mallee shrub 1-4mH x 1-4mW, with opposite large silvery leaves. The glaucous buds are followed by showy red flowers (to 10cm) throughout the year. Accepts most draining soils. Frost and drought tolerant
<i>Eucalyptus macrocarpa sbp. elachantha</i>
Sprawling mallee shrub 1-4mH x 1-4mW, with opposite silvery leaves. The glaucous buds are followed by showy pink- red flowers (5cm) throughout the year. Accepts most draining soils. Frost and drought tolerant
<i>Eucalyptus macrocarpa x younginana</i>
Upright mallee shrub 2-3mH x 2-3mW, silvery paired leaves. The large silver buds, are followed by large showy red flowers throughout the year. For most draining soils. Frost and drought tolerant when established
<i>Eucalyptus orbifolia</i>
Round Leaved Mallee. Shrub or small tree 2-4mH x 2-4mW with reddish 'minniritchi' bark and round grey leaves. Large clusters of creamy flowers from late winter to spring. For most soils in a warm site.
<i>Eucalyptus pachyphylla</i>
Ornamental mallee 1.5m-4mH x 3mW. This small ornamental eucalypt is known for the beautiful red/yellow buds and yellow flowers. Drought and frost tolerant on reasonably drained soils. Prune hard to rejuvenate.

Species List
<i>Eucalyptus polyanthemos</i>
Red Box. Beautiful tree to 25mH with wavy grey bark on trunk, smooth grey above. Grey green rounded leaves. Cream flowers. For dry site in light shallow soils. Foliage and buds used in floristry. Can be copiced.
<i>Eucalyptus populnea</i>
Poplar or Bimble box. Tree to 20 m high; the bark grey with whitish patches and is persistent on trunk and larger branches. Adult leaves are glossy and bright green.
<i>Eucalyptus pulverulenta</i>
Small twisted tree to 4mH with silver-grey stem-clasping foliage. White flowers from Sept-Nov. Hardy in sun in well-drained soils. May be pruned hard or coppiced. Good foliage contrast, used in floral arrangements.
<i>Eucalyptus pyriformis</i>
Pear-fruited Mallee. Mallee 2-3mH x 3- 4mW, smooth bark & pale to mid green leaves. Cream, pink to red flowers. Draining soils in a hot site. Not for frost hollows. Good in a pot.
<i>Eucalyptus shirleyi</i>
Small tree to 7mH x 3mW with black corrugated bark and silver stalkless leaves. White flowers in panicles with long stems Jan-June, small buds and fruit. Well drained dry heavy soils. Good cut foliage.
<i>Eucalyptus sideroxylon ‘Pretty Pink’</i>
Mugga Ironbark. Medium tree 3-8mH x 4- 6mW with dark, deeply fissured bark. Greyish leaves, pretty pink flowers in winter and spring. Accepts a wide range of soils. Wonderful for birds. Frost, drought and salt tolerant.
<i>Eucalyptus staigeriana</i>
Lemon scented Ironbark. Slow growing slender upright tree to 3mH. Crushed leaves give a sweet lemon smell, can be used in cooking/teas. Accepts most soils to heavy loams. Frost, wind and drought tolerant.
<i>Eucalyptus torquata</i>
Coral Gum. Small tree to 8mH x 3mW with attractive buds & fruit. Pinky cream flowers Sept-Jan. For most draining soils in a warm sunny spot. Moderately frost hardy.
<i>Eucalyptus youngiana</i>
Mallee 1.5m-4mH x 1-3mW. This small ornamental eucalypt is known for the beautiful huge buds and red flowers throughout the year. Drought and frost tolerant on non water logging soils. Prune hard to rejuvenate.
<i>Ficinia nodosa</i>
Syn Isolepis n-. Knobby Club Rush. Small slow spreading perennial 0.5-1.5mH x 0.6-2mW, green upright stems. Dense globular red-brown flower heads just below the stem tip. For moist soils (takes dry times) in sun to part shade.
<i>Goodenia varia</i>
Small shrub 0.1-0.6mH x 0.5-1.5mW with oblong, usually toothed, foliage. Yellow flowers are sporadic throughout the year. Likes well-drained soils in sun. Responds to pruning. Good for hanging baskets, or embankments
<i>Grevillea 'Iced VoVo'</i>
Large shrub 2.5mH x 3mW. Long deeply lobed leaves with pale and deep pink toothbrush flowers in spring and summer. Draining site in sun or semi-shade. Excellent quick growing screen plant. Nesting sites for birds.
<i>Grevillea ‘Jasper Cross’</i>
G iaspicula x floribunda. Compact shrub 1.3mH x 1.5mW, with arching branches and pendent clusters of pink and cream flowers May-Dec. For draining soils in sun to semi-shade. Very attractive. Drought and frost hardy.

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<i>Grevillea 'Little Gem'</i>
Shrub 1mH x 1mW with finely divided grey-green leaves and orange red spider flowers in win/spr. For dry or moist draining site in full or part sun. Tolerates lime.
<i>Grevillea 'Poorinda Anticipation'</i>
Vigorous shrub 2mH x 2.5mW. Long deeply lobed leaves and pink toothbrush flowers in spring and summer. Draining site in sun or semi-shade. Excellent quick growing open screen plant. Nesting sites for birds.
<i>Grevillea 'Poorinda Rondeau'</i>
Medium shrub 1.5-2mH x 1.5-3mW, with shiny dark-green oval leaves. Showy, profuse bright pinkish-red flowers July-Nov. For most well-drained acid soils in sun. Hardy to most frosts. Prune lightly for good shape.
<i>Grevillea 'Splendour'</i>
Syn G. 'Ruby Clusters'. Vigorous shrub to 2- 4mH x 3-5mW, deep green elliptic leaves and bronze new foliage. Showy ruby red flowers most of year. Wide range of fairly well-drained soils, sun or semi-shade. Responds to pruning. Birds.
<i>Grevillea alpina (red & white)</i>
A medium shrub 1-1.5mH x 1.5mW. Small felty grey leaves, red and white flowers September-December. For a warm, well-drained spot with light shade. Excellent Container plant . Tip prune from an early age.
<i>Grevillea arenaria</i>
Dense stiff shrub 1.5-3mH x 2-3mW. Grey- green foliage and red, pink, green, yellow or orange spider flowers over a long period. Hardy in all aspects and soils except wet. Attractive to birds.
<i>Grevillea beadleana</i>
Dense spreading shrub 1.5mH x 2.5mW with soft, grey-green, much divided leaves. Dark-red toothbrush flowers most of year. Most well-drained soils in sun or dappled shade. Screen or hedge, attracts birds.
<i>Grevillea flexuosa</i>
Spectacular, vigourous large shrub 2mH x 2mW. Deeply lobed leaves and unusual cream fragrant flowers in spring. Reasonably drainage in sun or semi-shade. Excellent quick growing screen plant. Nesting sites for birds.
<i>Grevillea floribunda</i>
Small to medium shrub 1-1.3mH x 1- 1.5mW, deep-green elliptical leaves, pendent racemes of rusty-green or gold flowers May-Dec, but mainly spring. Freely draining soils in a warm sunny spot. Tip prune from an early age.
<i>Grevillea iaspicula</i>
A medium shrub 1.5mH x 1.5mW with narrow light green foliage. Cream and red flowers from May-Nov. For draining soils in sun to semi-shade. Prune for bushy growth. Rare and endangered plant.
<i>Grevillea juniperina 'Molonglo'</i>
Low spreading shrub 0.5mH x 3mW with small narrow prickly foliage. Apricot flowers in spring and summer. Good drainage in most soils and full sun for best flowering. Vigorous grower. Good ground cover. Bird attracting.
<i>Grevillea lanigera (lutea)</i>
Small shrub to 1mH x 1.5-2mW, soft grey foliage. Lime green/ cream flowers in winter and spring. For most well-drained soils in sun or semi-shade. For general planting.

Species List
<i>Grevillea laurifolia</i>
Prostrate shrub 2.5-5mW. Ovate to elliptic dark green leaves, deep red toothbrush flowers Nov-Jan. For free draining acidic soils and a light overhead canopy of foliage. Yearly pruning for vigorous plant.
<i>Grevillea scortechinii</i>
Spreading groundcover x 2mW with olive green holly-like leaves. Unique black toothbrush flowers in spring till autumn. Most draining soils in dry or moist site in full or filtered sun. Frost tolerant. Very rare plant.
<i>Grevillea semperflorens</i>
An early hybrid Grevillea to 2mH x 2mW. Pink and apricot flowers a seen most of the year on arching branches of grey green leaves. Tolerates acid neutral clay or loam soils. Frost and drought hardy
<i>Hakea 'Burrendong Beauty Baby'</i>
A seed grown shrub 2mH x 1.5mW, with stiff blueish green oval leaves. Conspicuous two toned red/pink/maroon or cream flowers at the base of most leaves in Autumn. For draining soils in part sun. Prune for bushy growth.
<i>Hakea 'Double Gate'</i>
H. francisiana x bucculenta. Erect shrub 3mH x 3mW with long leaves. Attractive spikes of hot pink flowers in winter to spring. Dry sunny site in light-med soils with good drainage. Prune when young for windy sites. Attracts birds. Drought, lime and frost hardy.
<i>Hakea 'Morgan'</i>
H. bucculenta x francisiana. Erect shrub 3mH x 3mW with long leaves. Attractive hot pink flower spikes winter - spring. Dry sunny site in draining light-med soils. Prune when young in windy sites. Attracts birds. Drought, lime and frost hardy.
<i>Hakea 'Tessa'</i>
H. multilineata x grammatophylla A variable shrub to 2.5mH, with narrow grey-green leaves to 16cm long Showy crimson pink scented flowers appear in the leaf axils from March to August. Draining soils in a sunny to part shaded site. Drought and frost hardy.
<i>Hakea coriacea</i>
Erect shrub 5mH x 3mW with long leaves. Attractive spikes of cream & red flowers in spring. Dry spot in light-med soils with good drainage. Sun or part shade. Drought and frost hardy when established.
<i>Hakea cucullata</i>
Erect sparingly branched shrub, 1–4 m tall, striking cup shaped leaves clasping the stem. In early spring the pretty pink flowers appear nestled in the leaves. Lightly prune to shape. For a well drained sunny site, frost and drought tolerant.
<i>Hakea decurrens</i>
Medium suckering shrub to 2mH x 1mW with young red stems. Fine prickly foliage. Profuse white flowers follow pink tinged buds in winter. For draining soils in shade to full sun. Good refuge for small birds.
<i>Hakea francisiana</i>
Erect shrub 5mH x 3mW with long leaves. Attractive spikes of hot pink flowers in winter to spring. Dry sunny warm spot in light-med soils with good drainage. Prune when young for windy sites. Attracts birds. Drought, lime and frost hardy when established.

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<i>Hakea grammatophylla</i>
A small variable shrub up to 2mH, with narrow grey-green leaves up to 16cm long, with finely striated veins. Showy red scented flowers appear in the leaf axils from March to August. Drought and frost hardy.
<i>Hakea laurina</i>
Pincushion Hakea. Erect or weeping shrub to 4mH x 4mW, long oblong leaves. Showy round heads of red and cream flowers, autumn & winter. For a sunny draining site. Not for frost hollows.
<i>Hakea multilineata</i>
Outstanding large upright shrub 3-4mH x 2mW. Long narrow stiff leaves and spikes of vivid pink flowers in winter and spring. Dry or moist well-drained soils in filtered or full sun. Grow with other plants. Bird plant.
<i>Hakea petiolaris</i>
Tall shrub 3mH x 2mW with rounded grey-green leaves. Green/pink sea urchin flowers aging to cream/maroon in autumn and winter. Needs reasonable drainage and plenty of sun. Prune lightly. Very ornamental.
<i>Hakea purpurea</i>
Medium shrub 1.5-2mH x 1.5-2mW with narrow leaves. Red, purple-red or pinkish flowers in winter and spring. Best in well-drained soils in sun. Tolerant of drought and moderately heavy frosts. Bird attracting.
<i>Hakea salicifolia</i>
Fast growing dense shrub 5mH x 4mW with long elliptic dark green leaves. White flowers in winter/spring. For most soils, even boggy. Suits most aspects. Responds to pruning. Good hedge or screen plant. Attracts birds.
<i>Hakea salicifolia (fine leaf)</i>
Fast growing dense weeping shrub 5-8mH x 4mW with long narrow leaves. White flowers in winter/spring. For most soils, even boggy. Suits most aspects. Responds to pruning. Good hedge or screen plant. Attracts birds.
<i>Hakea teretifolia</i>
Prickly shrub to 1-2.5mH x 0.5-2mW with needle like leaves. Creamy white flowers in spring and summer. Tolerates any soils in sun or part shade, even with excess moisture. Salt resistant. Prune regularly. Very hardy.
<i>Hakea victoria</i>
Royal Hakea. Sparsely branched shrub 3mH x 1.5mW with rounded variegated prickly leaves. Small clusters of cream flowers in spr. Very well-drained light-med soil in sunny spot. Feature plant.
<i>Hakea x laurina</i>
Pincushion Hakea. Erect or spreading shrub to 4mH x 3mW with long pointed leaves. Globular heads of red & cream flowers in autumn & winter. Likes a sunny well-drained site. Attracts birds. Fast growing, drought and frost hardy
<i>Hardenbergia ‘Bonnie Bilby’</i>
Compact to 0.5mH x 0.3W with small lance-shaped leaves. Masses of purple flowers in spring. Full sun to part shade on draining soils. Prune hard. Frost and drought tolerant. Bred by Bilby Blooms
<i>Hardenbergia ‘Mini Ha Ha’</i>
Compact small shrub or trailing plant to 1mW with small lance-shaped leaves. Masses of purple pea flowers in spring. Full sun to partly shaded draining position. May be pruned hard. Frost hardy.

Species List
<i>Hardenbergia comptoniana</i>
Native Lilac. Vigorous climber with trifoliolate leaves. Mauve to purplish-blue pea-shaped flowers Aug-Nov. For well- drained soils in part sun to dappled shade. Needs overhead cover in cold areas.
<i>Hardenbergia violacea</i>
Ground cover or trailing plant to 1.5mW with lance-shaped leaves. Masses of purple flowers in spring. Full sun to partly shaded draining position. May be pruned hard. Not for frost hollows.
<i>Hardenbergia violacea (pink)</i>
Groundcover or trailing plant to 1.5m-2mW with lance-shaped leaves. Masses of pink flowers in spring. Full sun to partly shaded well-drained position. May be pruned hard. Some frost damage. Not for frost hollows.
<i>Hardenbergia violacea (white)</i>
Groundcover or trailing plant to 1.5m-2mW with lance-shaped leaves. Masses of white flowers in spring. Full sun to partly shaded well-drained position. May be pruned hard. Some frost damage. Not for frost hollows.
<i>Hovea lanceolata</i>
Open shrub 2mH x 1mW. Narrow leaves. Blue pea flowers in late winter or spring. Likes excellent drainage, cool root run and some overhead shade. Light pruning beneficial.
<i>Hovea rosmarinifolia</i>
Light shrub 1.5mH x 1.5mW with hairy branches and stiff linear leaves with pale backs. Mauve pea flowers in spring, then oval hairy fruit. Freely draining acidic- neutral soils in shade or part sun. Prune.
<i>Indigofera adesmiifolia</i>
Open spreading shrub 1.5mH x 1mW with small blue-green leaves on flattened stems. Pink pea flowers in spring. For dry or moist well-drained soils in part sun. Prune after flowering.
<i>Indigofera australis</i>
Open spreading shrub 1.5-2.5mH x 1-2mW with blue-green leaves. Mauve-pink pea flowers in spring. For dry or moist well- drained soils in part sun. Prune after flowering. Colonizer.
<i>Isopogon formosus</i>
Rounded shrub, 1.5mH x 1.5mW, with narrow divided leaves. Large terminal heads of pink flowers in winter-spring followed by globular cones. Needs well- drained soils (raised bed), in sun or semi-shade.
<i>Isopogon latifolius</i>
Shrub rarely to 2mH x 1mW. The light green leaves and outstanding large terminal pink cone flowers make this a stunning cut flower and garden plant. For well drained acid neutral soils. Moderate drought and frost hardy
<i>Isopogon petiolaris</i>
Small shrub 0.6-1.3mH x 1-1.5mW with prickly much divided foliage. Yellow globe- shaped flowers from Oct-Feb. Likes free draining acidic soils in dappled shade. Responds well to pruning.
<i>Isotoma fluviatilis</i>
Small creeping plant spreading to 0.5mW with small round crowded foliage and blue star flowers in spring and summer. Wet sunny position. Suit poolside, boggy sites or in a pot.
<i>Jacksonia scoparia</i>
A shrub to 4mH x 2mW, often tree-like in form, with pendulous grey, leafless branches. Profuse orange pea flowers in late spring. For most reasonably drained soils in full sun to part shade.

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<i>Kennedia macrophylla</i>
A vigorous climber or ground cover with dense dark green leaves and attractive orange and yellow pea flowers. Fast growing, useful for quick coverage of ugly fences or banks. Hardy plant, tolerant of drought, light frost a wide range of soils and shade.
<i>Kennedia retrorsa</i>
Vigorous climbing plant with dark green leaves. Purple/pink pea flowers in spring. For fairly well-drained soils in most situations. Makes a good ground cover among mature plants and under trees.
<i>Kunzea parvifolia</i>
Spreading plant 2mH x 2mW with tiny heath like foliage. Very pretty mauve fluffy flowers in spring. For most soils in full or filtered sun. Spring spectacle. Very hardy.
<i>Kunzea pomifera</i>
Muntrie - Prostrate woody shrub, spreads to 1.5mW, with small shiny round leaves and feathery white flowers in late spring. Purplish edible berries. Needs full or part sun and reasonable drainage. Popular bush food plant.
<i>Logania albiflora</i>
Small erect shrub to 1mH, with small dark green linear leaves. Small white sweetly scented flowers in spring. For draining soils in part sun to semi-shade. Hardy.
<i>Mazus pumilio</i>
Perennial mat-forming plant to 0.5m diam with rosettes of leaves flat on the ground. Quaint white or purple flowers on erect stems. Needs a wet situation. Becomes trailing plant in shade.
<i>Melaleuca incana</i>
Attractive pendulous shrub to 3mH x 1.5mW. Soft grey leaves, yellow brushes in spring. Prefers clay soils in filtered or full sun. Protect from heavy frosts when young. Prefers not to be crowded.
<i>Melaleuca thymifolia</i>
Small rounded shrub to 1mH x 1mW with small grey elliptic foliage. Purple, pink or white claw flowers in late spring to autumn. Hardy plant in sunny site. Enjoys moist position but tolerates dry. Prune after flowering.
<i>Melaleuca thymifolia 'Cotton Candy'</i>
Small shrub to 1mH x 1mW, fine grey green leaves. Showy bright pink claw flowers spr- aut. For most soils in sun to part shade. Enjoys a moist spot. Prune after flowering. Suit rockery.
<i>Microseris lanceolata</i>
Yam Daisy. Small perennial herb 0.4mH x 0.3mW. Slender basal leaves and yellow daisy flowers from October. Fairly well-drained soils in sun or part shade. Drought hardy. Rockery or pot plant. Edible roots/yams, dormant over summer
<i>Orthrosanthus multiflorus</i>
Iris-like plant to 0.4 mH with strappy light green foliage. Many spikes of blue flowers in late spring or summer. Sunny well-drained position. Hardy in most soils. Suitable for rockery.
<i>Pandorea pandorana 'Ruby Belle'</i>
Twining climber with glossy oval leaves. Red/maroon bell flowers mainly in spring. Well-composted soils in some shade. Fast-growing. Prune well. Some frost damage when young or in heavy frosts. Ideal screen.
<i>Petrophile canescens</i>
Erect shrub 1-3mH x 1mW, often sparsely branched. Spreading divided leaves to 10 cms. Creamy yellow flowers in spring and summer. Cones prominent. For well- drained soils in full sun or part shade.

Species List
<i>Phebalium nottii 'Kay Bryant'</i>
Small shrub to 1mH x 0.5mW. Pink flowers with striking yellow stamens mostly in spring. Suitable for full sun to heavy shade, reasonably hardy. Responds best to good drainage and acid soils. Drought and frost hardy.
<i>Philotheca 'Bournda Beauty'</i>
Syn Eriostemon myoporoides. Small shrub 1mH x 1.5mW with slightly warty foliage. A profusion of white flowers cover the bush in spring. For draining neutral to acid soils in sun to part shade. Prune to keep bushy.
<i>Philotheca buxifolia</i>
Dense shrub 0.5-0.7mH x 1.2-1.6mW with leathery round leaves. Pink buds and profuse white starry flowers in spring. Moist well-drained light or medium soils in part sun with cool root run. Attractive small shrub.
<i>Philotheca ciliata</i>
Medium open shrub to 2mH x 2mW, with heath like leaves. Clusters of white starlike flowers spring/summer/autumn. For well-drained soils in full or part sun. Good Container plant. Drought and frost hardy.
<i>Philotheca myoporoides 'Flower Girl'</i>
Medium shrub 1mH x 1mW with slightly warty foliage. Profuse pink buds followed by white flowers cover the bush from winter to spring. For well drained neutral to acid soils in sun to part shade. Prune to keep bushy.
<i>Poa sieberiana</i>
Tussock forming grass to 0.8mH with fine greyish leaves. Plume-like heads of flowers on long stems. Will flourish in most situations, even dry sites. Excellent for seed eating birds such as finches.
<i>Podolepis neglecta</i>
A tufty perennial daisy to 0.7mH with several stems. Showy orange-yellow daisy flowers in summer. Range of soils with shrubs or grasses in sun or semi-shade. Dies back in winter. Protect from slugs and snails.
<i>Pratia concolor</i>
Attractive groundcover prostrate-0.2mH x 0.4-1mW forming a close mat. White or light blue star like flowers in spring & summer. For heavy soils periodically damp in sun to part shade. Responds to pruning. Good pot plant.
<i>Prostanthera 'Mauve Mantle'</i>
Attractive plant for colour and fragrance 0.6mH x 1.5mW with small dark green leaves and mauve flowers in spring. Reasonable drainage and some overhead cover best. Excellent container plant. Good under trees.
<i>Prostanthera ovalifolia (variegata)</i>
Aromatic shrub to 1.5mH x 1mW, green & cream leaves & many purple-blue flowers in spr. Prefers good drainage in light to med soils in part shade but tolerates heavy soils & dry periods. Likes the company of other plants.
<i>Prostanthera ovalifolia var purpurea</i>
Medium shrub 1.3-2mH x 1-1.5mW, dense aromatic dark green foliage and purple flowers in profusion in spring. For draining sites in part to full shade. Good under Eucalypts. Protect from hot winds.
<i>Prostanthera sp. Dunedoo Gap</i>
Upright shrub to 1mH x 1mW with small aromatic hairy leaves, sometimes with maroon tinge. Mauve to purple flowers in spring. Light to medium draining soils in full sun to semi-shade. Bee attracting.

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<i>Pycnosorus globosus</i>
Syn Craspedia globosa. Drumsticks. Robust tufty plant to 0.3mH x 0.3-0.5mW with silvery, linear leaves. Large yellow flower heads to 0.8mH in spring & summer. For most soils in sun.
<i>Rhagodia spinescens</i>
Spreading grey leaved plant 0.5m-1mH x 2mW with fire resistant foliage. Grows in most soils in sunny sites. Responds to pruning. Good low maintenance hedge or ground cover. Toughy. Contrast plant. Edible berries.
<i>Rhodanthe chlorocephala</i>
subsp. splendida Erect annual to 0.6mH with smooth narrow leaves. Large cream or white papery flowers in late spring & summer. For well- composted spots in full sun. Protect seedlings from heavy frosts. Good in rockery.
<i>Sollya heterophylla Blue</i>
A vigorous climber or twining shrub, to 3mH. Lovely blue bell flowers in clusters throughout year, mainly July to March followed by fleshy green fruits. Accepts moderate to good drainage in alkaline and acid soils. Frost hardy.
<i>Spiranthes australis</i>
Ladies Tresses. A small orchid that favours well drained moist sites, with part shade in drier sites. Hot pink flowers arranged in a spiral on the stem are a Christmas bonus.
<i>Stylidium adnatum</i>
Trigger plant. Bushlet 0.05-0.3mH with bright green leaves and clusters of white/pale pink flowers in spring & summer. For moist soils in part shade to filtered sun. An excellent pot plant flowering for long periods.
<i>Stylidium debile</i>
Fragile Trigger plant. Dainty suckering perennial herb with loose rosettes of leaves at the base of short stems. Pretty pink flowers with yellow markings for most of the year. Moist draining soils in part shade. Excellent container plant.
<i>Stypandra glauca</i>
Nodding Blue Lily. Tufting plant with blue- green leaves to 1mH x 0.6-1.2mW. Sprays of starry blue flowers with yellow anthers in spring. For draining soils in part shade.
<i>Swainsona galegifolia</i>
Perennial to 1mH with multiple stems of pinnate leaves. Large sprays of pink pea flowers. Sunny position in all but very wet soils. Cut back old stems after flowering to get lush new growth.
<i>Swainsona galegifolia (burgundy)</i>
Upright plant to 1.5mH with many stems of pinnate leaves. Sprays of burgundy pea flowers spr/sum/aut. For most soils (not wet) in sun. Prune old stems after flowering.
<i>Tetragonia tetragonioides</i>
Native Spinach. Prostrate sprawling shrub 0.5-1mH by 2mW. This bush tucker plant is like spinach, blanch before eating. It grows throughout the year, regular harvesting keeps plant vigorous. Draining soils full sun to shade.
<i>Thelionema caespitosum (blue)</i>
Tufted plant with grass-like leaves 0.3m long. Deep blue star flowers on slender branched stems in summer. Relatively well-drained position in good sunlight. Containers or open ground.
<i>Thelionema caespitosum (white)</i>
Tufted plant with grass-like leaves 0.3m long. White star flowers on slender branched stems in summer. Relatively well-drained position in good sunlight. Does well in containers or open ground.

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<i>Thelionema grande</i>
Tufted plant to 1.2mH x 0.3mW, with broad strappy leaves. Blue star-like flowers appear on slender branched stems in spring. For light to medium soils in sun or part shade. Very frost hardy.
<i>Thelionema umbellatum</i>
Tufted plant with grass-like leaves, 0.2mH x 0.3mW, groups of cream flowers on slender branched stems, held among leaves, in summer. Relatively well-drained soils in full or part sun. Pot or open ground.
<i>Viola hederacea</i>
Native Violet. Small spreading ground cover forming extensive mats in damp areas. Round leaves. White and purple violet-shaped flowers for long periods. Full sun to part shade. Dies back in winter. Useful for hanging baskets.
<i>Viola silicestris (blue)</i>
Sandstone Violet. Small spreading ground cover forming extensive mats in damp areas. Round leaves. Blue flowers for long periods. Hardy in full sun to full shade. Dies back in winter. Useful for hanging baskets.
<i>Westringia 52</i>
W. fruticosa x longifolia Medium shrub 2.5mH x 2mW. Dense grey-green foliage with white flowers in spring and summer. Extremely hardy fast growing screen, full sun to partial shade. Suitable for difficult positions.
<i>Westringia brevifolia var. raleighii</i>
Medium shrub 1.5mH x 1.5mW. Silvery grey foliage, mauve flowers all year. Very hardy with well-drained soil in sun or semi- shade. Responds to pruning for compact bushy growth. Ideal for low clipped hedge.
<i>Westringia fruticosa 'Zena'</i>
Small shrub to 0.75mH x 1mW. Grey-green foliage with white flowers mainly in spring. Hardy in most soils in full sun or partial shade. Suitable for shrubbery or low hedge.
<i>Xanthorrhoea glauca subsp. angustifolia</i>
Grass Tree. Trunk 1-4mH. In three years radiating leaves will make a attractive feature. Most draining soils in sun or part shade. Frost and drought hardy. Can flower within 5 years.
<i>Xanthorrhoea johnsonii</i>
Grass Tree. Slow growth, eventually with a trunk 1-5mH, and flowering spike to 4m. In three years radiating leaves will make a fine specimen plant. Well drained sunny spot in well composted soil.
<i>Xerochrysum bracteatum (mixed colour)</i>
Quick growing plant to 0.75mH x 0.5mW with green leaves. Coloured buds and large copper-red/purple/pink paper daisies all year. Sun or semi-shade in most situations. Prune by picking flowers to promote more flowering.
